#### Pastor Search Team Formal Recommendation to the Elders

As a team, we have been meeting and praying together since January. While we may detail in this report the work and contacts we have made, we realize it is God's work, God's connections, and God's movement in people's hearts that make a recommendation and a fit possible.

We followed a similar process as we did five years ago. One of the changes we made was to seek referrals with personal contacts and inquiries to seminaries and pastors instead of blanket advertisements. We received a significant number of names and recommendations. We followed up with each name. We heard back from 57 possible candidates. For the most part, the candidates were well qualified. Of those applicants, we sent questionnaires to seven, seeking additional information and answers to some targeted questions. We then took several weeks with each questionnaire, praying over it and studying it, while doing additional research on those candidates. This process always included statistical information and, in many cases, it also included contacting other pastors, counselors and leaders.

We ultimately ended with three top candidates, all with successful experience as senior pastors. Together they had a combined 40 years of experience as a senior pastor. God clearly answered our very specific prayers. He removed other candidates so we could focus on the one individual who is best equipped to lead Ridgecrest. God helped to bring our team together, and He helped us to have a shared perspective on this topic.

- The church relocated in 2011 to a new 22-acre property with a new multipurpose facility.
- First Baptist gives 12 percent to the Cooperative Program.
- The Church is on mission in Taiwan and Italy and makes at least one churchwide mission trip to each location every year.
- In Taiwan, the church leads English camps in junior high and high schools, sharing the Gospel with the hope of one day establishing church plants in cities lacking an evangelical church.
- In Italy, the church comes alongside a small, but feisty, church south of Verona to facilitate church growth and church strengthening.
- The church developed its local missions initiative, "God Loves Desoto" (GLD), to take the Gospel out into the community (car shows, interaction with public school system, serving ministry).

Dr. Muniz was elected by the convention and will serve as MBC president for at least one year. His duties will include chairing meetings of the MBC executive committee and chairing next year's state convention.

#### Q & A with Dr. Jeremy Muniz

# THIS IS WHY I AM COMPELLED TO CONSIDER THIS NEW POSSIBILITY, TRUSTING THAT GOD WILL PROVIDE FOR MY FAMILY

#### Why are you considering a call to a new church?

God has graciously allowed me to remain in one pastorate for 18 years. My children have known no other church family. From a purely rational point of view, it would be best for us to stay where we are for another four years so our children will not have to contend with a major transition in their lives at such a critical time. However, we serve a God who called Abraham to leave his country and kin to make a great nation (Genesis 12:1). We serve a God who redirected the Apostle Paul from Asia to Europe at a critical juncture in his ministry (Acts 16:6).

And finally, we serve a God who called men like William Carey and Adoniram Judson to sacrifice more than my heart can fathom to serve God faithfully. My wife and I want to be faithful to our Savior, and we want to honor His call in our lives, wherever that may lead. There are no words I can use to express the mysterious stirring in my heart that I am experiencing. It feels God is doing something new in my life and in our family. In the face of such mystery, all we can do is faithfully take



one step at a time.

This is why I am compelled to consider this new possibility, trusting that God will provide for my family.

## How do you build trust with the congregation?

One of my favorite passages of scripture is I John 4:18. It reads, "There is no fear in love, but perfect love casts out fear." The only way a transition such as this will be

successful is if the new pastor determines from the start that love will win the day.

I would communicate clearly with the congregation the call to "love one another" and express that love tangibly through humble ministry. Our Lord washed the feet of His disciples (John 13), and I feel such servant leadership, filled with the deep love of God, is the biblical way to build trust. Finally, I believe a steady diet of faithful biblical preaching will help join hearts together.

#### Describe your pastoral style.

I was called to pastor my first church at age 19. From my first Sunday in the pulpit to the present, I believe God has put a deep love in my heart for the people of God. Ministry can be stressful and preaching is hard work. But no matter how many challenges I have faced in pastoral ministry, the joy of getting to be with Christ-followers and sharing life together with them has been a primary motivator of my life and pastoral

calling. I do feel the call to be a lover of the souls of men, women, boys and girls. My doctoral dissertation focused on funeral preaching due to my conviction that emotionally trying times provide an open door for Gospel grace and divine mercy. I approach the pastorate as a doctor of souls. I want to bind up broken hearts and help them find healing in the grace and mercy of our Lord Jesus Christ.

#### How do you make time for your family?

A pastor has to work hard to find balance in this crucial area of life. I have found this balance has to be calibrated in light of the current season of life my family is experiencing. For example, when my children were little, I consciously avoided denominational endeavors or mission trips that would keep me away from my family. I felt my primary ministry in those days was to care for my wife and children by helping with their everyday needs. As my children have grown and become more self-sufficient, I have increased my denominational service and the frequency of mission trips. Currently, my day off is Friday, and I try to accomplish every household chore or task during the time my children are at school. This provides us with more time to enjoy our weekends as a family. Because of my wife's career as a public school teacher and my children's busy extracurricular activities, we have to work hard and plan well to spend quality time together as a family.

I felt this was an opportunity the Lord wanted me to pursue.

#### What did you see that attracted you to our church?

As an officer of the Missouri Baptist Convention, I have known about Ridgecrest for several years. I have been impressed with the Great Commission passion of your congregation and your generosity as it relates to the Cooperative Program. In the past few years, your former pastor and I became friends while serving on the executive board of the

MBC. Through that friendship, I was able to learn about the church's great love for its pastor and the many ways Ridgecrest was doing its part to fulfill the Great Commission. My heart has been content to remain in my current ministry context. However, when I received an invitation from the committee to submit a résumé, I felt this was an opportunity the Lord wanted me to pursue. Had I not been familiar with Ridgecrest, I might not have inquired further.
